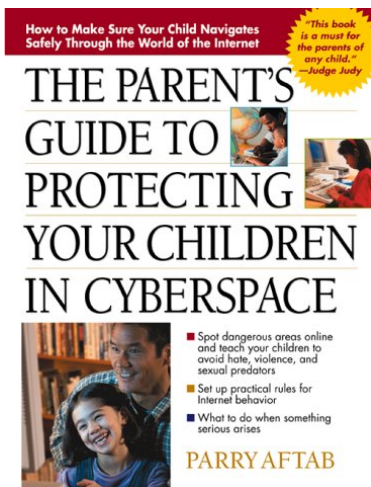

Being a parent can be a rewarding but stressful endeavor, and in today's networked world, it is not just physical risks to children that have to be considered in modern parenting strategies.
